River runner / nature lover to back up Troop service projects along the State Scenic Olentangy River, in fall or spring. A great family job: one to lead, one to load!

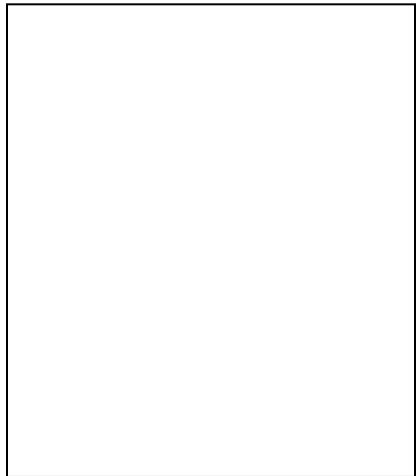
Biker dude (1 or 2) to support bike outings during the program year. Got the
