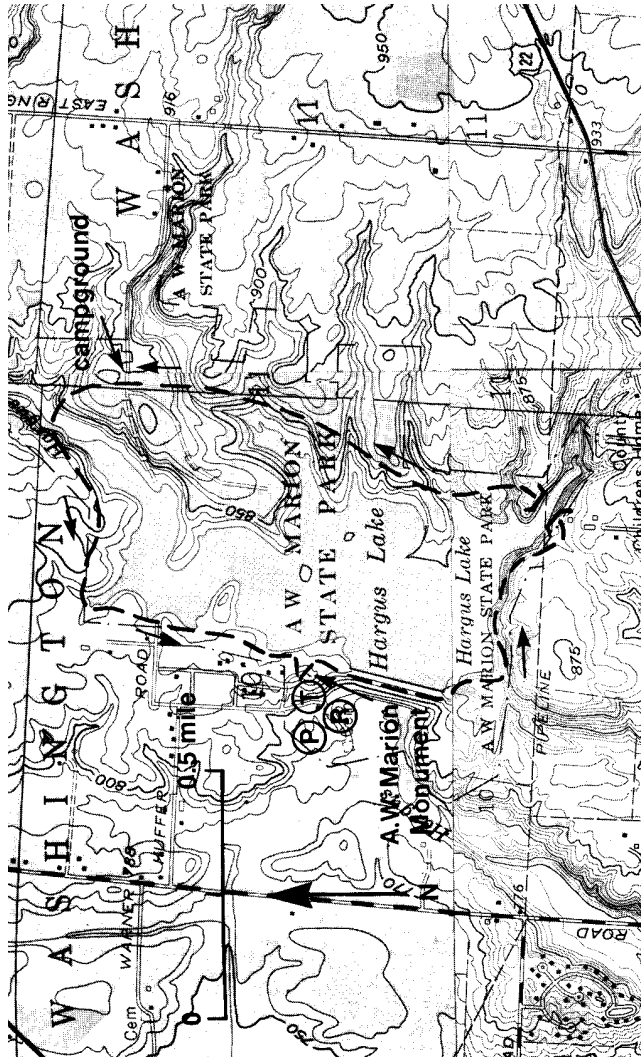


**Hargus Lake Trail**  
 A.W. Marion State Park  
 Length - 5 miles

**Chicken One Pot**

Per Person

1	5 oz.	Can of Cooked Chicken Chunks
1/2	Bag	Success Instant Rice (to make 1 cup rice per person)(4 bags/box)
1/2		Carrot
1/3		Stalk Celery
1/2		Small Onion
2	Envelope	Spring Vegetable Cup o' Soup Mix (4 Envelopes/ box)

1. Clean and slice carrots into disks about 1/8" thick (may be done at home), slice celery into slices about 1/4" thick (may be done at home) and dice onion.
2. Place carrots and rice bags in a pot of enough boiling water to cover and cook 10 minutes.
3. Remove rice and reduce water to about 1/2 cup per person. Add remaining ingredients and bring to low boil. Reduce heat, add rice and simmer 15 to 20 minutes or until all ingredients are heated through.
4. Salt and pepper to taste.

Serves One, but can be expanded for a full patrol.

Directions: SR 23 south to Circleville, east on SR 22 to East Ringgold-Southern Rd. North to Warner-Huffer Rd. and west to group camp. Trail head is just east of amphitheater.

## **Rockets And Interceptors**

**Equipment:** 1 Bucket or large tin,  
Large number of colored balls or plastic clothes  
pegs all the same color,  
Stakes, pins or rope to mark off the target area

**Set-up:** This is played by two teams. The  
attacking team are rockets and the defending team  
interceptors. The target area is marked off and the  
bucket or large tin is placed in the center. This game  
is best played where there is a bit of cover for hiding  
and creeping up on the target, or at night when  
visibility is reduced.

**Play:** Only rockets are allowed to go inside the target  
area. Up to four interceptors are allowed to hover  
around the target area. The rockets have a base at  
which they pick up their warheads. Each rocket can  
carry only one warhead to the target area. If a rocket is  
tagged by an interceptor before going inside the target  
area, they must hand over their warhead and return to  
their base. 20 warhead in the bucket or tin destroy the  
interceptor target area.

**Scoring:** If the interceptor target area is not  
destroyed after 20 minutes then change over the teams  
so that everyone has a turn at attacking and defending.

Add time required to destroy target for each turn.  
Team with the shortest time as attackers or longest  
time as defenders is the winner.

**Directions:**

Take SR 23 south from Columbus to Circleville.

Take SR 22 east through Circleville past the Circleville Bible College and past first sign for AW Marion (marina & office) on Bolder- Pontius Rd. to East Ringgold -So. Rd and turn North.

Take Warner-Huffer Rd west to camp grounds - public camp is on south side and group camp on north side just west of amphitheater.

Hargus Lake Trail (5 miles) starts just east of amphitheater and ends at public site 24.
