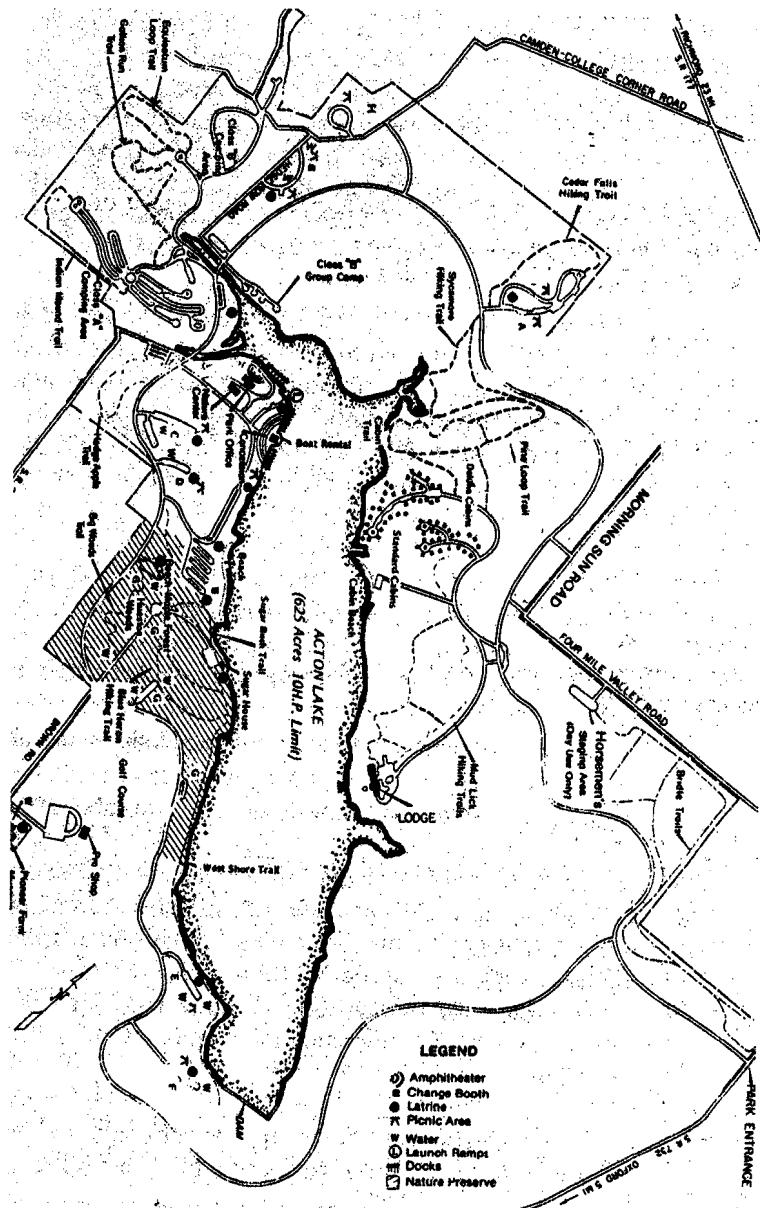

# Chicken a L'Orange

8		Chicken Breast Halves, boned, skinned
2	Med.	Oranges
1	C	Flour
3	tsp	Salt
1	tsp	Paprika
1/2	C	Olive Oil
2	C	Chicken Broth
6	Sprigs	Fresh Mint (optional)
2	Med.	Oranges, sliced thin (optional)

1. Rinse and pat dry the chicken breast halves.
2. Place chicken in zip lock bag.
3. Grate the orange peel over the chicken. Cut oranges into quarters and squeeze juice over the chicken. Marinate 1 hour.
4. Mix flour, salt, and paprika. Roll chicken in the mixture.
5. Heat oil in the Dutch Oven and lightly brown chicken on both sides. Remove most of the oil.
6. Add broth and remaining juice and grated rind left from the marinade.
7. Cook 35 min. with 13 coals on top and 13 on bottom.
8. Garnish with sprigs of mint and thin slices of orange to serve.

Serves: 5 - 8

Serve over rice or with potatoes and salad.
