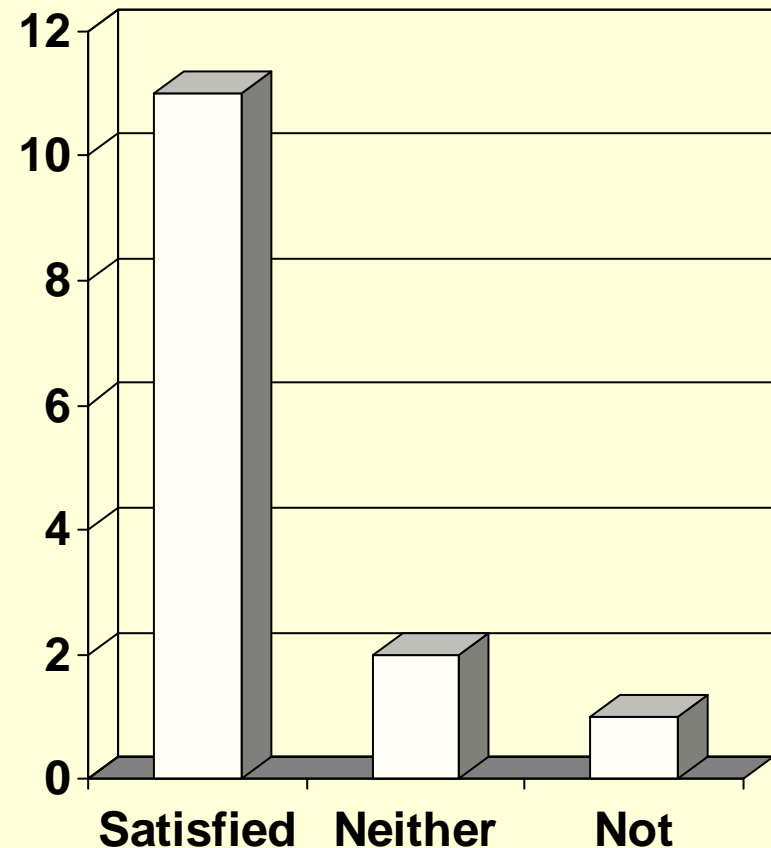


Indoor Meeting Satisfaction?

- One’s really unhappy



The model: “debriefing”

1. Stop

-- This didn't work

2. Start

-- To make it better

3. *Continue*

-- Doing this: it's good

Continue?

- demonstrations, activities
- attending cub scout crossovers! (and other such events)
- the current troop meeting format
- including the little kids
- everything
- presentation every meeting
- competition
- having regular campouts
- order of events
- competition

Start?

- more scouts involved in demonstrations
- practice our flag ceremony to improve the quality and have better audience focus- including adults
- incorporating the skills back in, like the old plan
- doing 1 or 2 meetings every month
- have a skill, merit badge only meeting
- more patrol corner time
- shorter demonstrations
- old system – assuming meetings?
- more participation in meetings
- asking scouts more about why they aren't attending outings
- more games at meetings
- some advanced skills for older scouts
- announce opportunities for older scouts including open venturing / sea scout outings, events, competitions between troops
- going to historic locations more often, including put in bay
- get scouts attention by giving more info, presentations and pictures.

Stop?

- late-starting, lengthy meetings
- off-track (wandering) scouts
- **taking forever with announcements – we do not have to do them at all?**
- for the older kids in the troop, the new format doesn't work as well
- **doing the flag skit every year**
- **having so many gear briefings**
- lengthy demonstrations
- short patrol corners
- having David & Joe be the only one doing presentations
