Trek Check - Considerations for a Canoe Trek

Here's a last-minute check-off for your use.

- We've named a crew leader: a Scout, responsible for organizing & planning the crew's activities, ideally, someone trained as a junior leader, or who has gone to a high Adventure base who leads by example
- We've told people where we're going:
 - □ For instance, Quetico Provincial Park, Atikoken, Ontario
 - □ For instance, travelling through Canoe Canada Outfitters, 300 O'Brien Street, PO Box 1810, Atikokan, Ontario, Canada POT 1CO
 - □ **Emergency messages won't be received** until we come off the water: *for instance* Saturday, at 807-597-6418 or fax to 807-597-5804. Indicate the message is a dire emergency, for a member of BSA 365 crew.
- We've reviewed risk: severe weather; medical conditions; accidents; risks associated with being on large, cold lakes; encounters with wildlife
- We've reviewed risk prevention: 1st aid; purify water; wash & rinse dishes thoroughly; prescription drugs split; PFDs; shoes @ all times; buddy boats
- We've gathered personal gear to take:
 - All the forms: a BSA 365 consent form, your personal citizenship identification (a passport or a copy of a birth certificate plus a photo ID)
 - Road clothes, for the trip up & back
 - A Scout shirt for the road
 - A sleeping bag (& pad?) to sleep in on the road & in the cabin
 Saturday night before we get onto the water
 - Road cash: perhaps \$20
 - Road gear packed into a bag that can be left behind
 - Trek raingear
 - □ Trek windbreaker (if it's not your raingear)
 - Trek sturdy footwear
 - □ Trek hat (wide-brim?), sunglasses
 - Trek trousers

- □ Trek 2 or 3 pr heavy socks
- □ Trek heavy shirt, sweater or fleece
- Trek swim pants or shorts
- □ Trek underwear (you can wash it on the trail) & sleepwear (another underwear?)
- □ Trek insect repellent & sun block
- □ Trek a string or croakee for your glasses
- Trek necessary toilet articles, hand disinfectant to clean up, something to read on the toilet
- □ Trek camp shoes, light-weight, moccasins or sneakers or such
- □ Trek gear packed into a stuffsack you can put into the outfitter bag
- [Your own sleeping pad & sleeping bag, if you're taking it on the trek rather than leaving it behind]
- □ [Fishing tackle, if you decide not to share it]
- □ Trek water bottle, pint or liter (one per guy)
- □ Trek personal eating utensils: bowl, cup, spoon, pocket knife
- Your very own paddle & PFD if it has to come along because you love it so very much & just can't paddle without it
- A notebook to record impressions of the trip

We've gathered crew gear to share:

- □ Crew insect repellent & sun block
- Crew small flashlight
- Crew repair stuff (duct tape?) & tool (Leatherman?)
- Crew 1st aid kit [check with Hock if you don't have one yourself]
- Crew Polar pure water purifier [Hock provides]
- □ Crew 50' of 1/4" rope
- Crew sharpening stone or file
- Crew fillet knife
- Crew camera & film
- Crew shared fishing tackle
- Crew compasses (one for each boat)
- □ Crew cook gear we have to have (for instance, an outback oven)

We've organized our crew for duties each day
